Progressive Democrat Jason Call Raises More Than Every Other Challenger to Rep. Rick Larsen

Jason Call, progressive Democrat running for the U.S. House, has raised more money than any other challenger to Representative Rick Larsen in the August 2nd top-two primary for the Second Congressional District.

Gaining about \$33,600 in the second quarter, Call has now raised over \$155,000 – more than all seven Republicans in the race combined. “We’re experiencing momentum unlike anything we’ve had before,” Call said, “and I’m excited to soon be the first progressive ever to challenge Larsen in a general election.”

Campaign finance records submitted to the Federal Election Commission by Rep. Larsen reveal that fewer than three percent of overall fundraising came from small donors giving less than \$200. “We’re running a campaign with no corporate PAC money and with over *three-quarters* of fundraising coming from small donors,” said Call, Larsen’s leading challenger.

With an average of just \$22 from almost 7,000 contributions – most of them from Washington state – Jason Call has shown that he is the only challenger to Rep. Larsen raising serious money. Leif Johnson and Dan Matthews, the two Republicans who

have reported campaign finances to the FEC, have both loaned themselves \$10,000 or more with no significant fundraising otherwise.

Having knocked on over 12,000 doors and sent more than 90,000 text messages to voters, the Call campaign is outpacing competitors in the field more than two-to-one. "The best way to counter the influence of corporate special interests," Call explained, "is with the mass, genuinely grassroots movement we are building here in Northwest Washington."
